### Church Boys United in Brief

Church Boys United Football Club was officially started in 2008 in Kathmandu. It is registered in National Sports Council and in company category (limited). Church Boys is investing its resources to develop standard of football in Nepal and is willing to partner with any organization that is interested and willing to extend football from city to villages and host football events and other football related packages in Nepal.

We have organized various types of sports clinics, sports seminars which have encouraged young emerging players to perform in higher level. Many of the Church Boys raised up players are playing first division clubs.

Church Boys is Christian faith based non for profit sports organization. Its indirect aim is to share the good news of Jesus Christ to other players and to all in sporting field all around Nepal.

### Club Purposes are:

- to coach young emerging players,
- to partner with other organization to help develop standard of football,
- to bring out hidden and potential players that can contribute to the nation,
- to establish educational opportunity, and preserve religious and cultural heritage,
- to participate and organize football events to help fulfill national sports theme: *Vision 2020-Sports for National Pride and Healthy Citizen.*

### Where is the club and training venue?

Club is based in Kathmandu, at the south of the town; in Lalitpur Sub metropolitan city ward no. 14, near the ANFA Technical center in Chyasal. Club does not own its ground. Pitch is hired whenever training is organized.

Church Boys will hire either one of these three grounds:

1. ANFA Technical Center Chyasal, Lalitpur, 15 minute walk from hostel.
2. Buddhibikas Khelmandal, Lagankhel, Lalitpur, 15 minute drive from hostel.
3. Pepsicola Town Planning, Pepsicola-35, Kathmandu is 20 minute drive from hostel.

### Where does Player Stay?

Church Boys has its own rented house in Koteshwor in Kathmandu where player are kept. Their lodging and food are provided. Local player join the training from home.

### How many Players in the divisions?

'C' qualifying, there will be 18 players for each club in 'C' qualifying tournaments. It's not a league, it's a knockout tournament. Whoever is group champion will be upgraded to 'C' division and there will be 2 to 4 groups. ANFA decides how many groups and how many clubs to upgrade. The teams will be from 70-100 teams participating in qualifying.



**'C' Division League**, a club in 'C' division can register as much as 25 players for round robin league among the 15 clubs. Sometime ANFA changes the numbers. Two relegates to non-division and two are upgraded to 'B' Division.

**'B' Division League**, a club in 'B' division can register up 30 players including 5 international players. Last two clubs in the point will lower to C division and topper two is upgraded to A Division.

**'A' Division League**, there were 18 A division clubs in 2011. Each club can registered up to 35 players including 7 international players. ANFA changes the number of club in 'A' division. 4 clubs at the bottom were lower to 'B' Division in 2011. Top 6, as known as 'super six' joins the 'National League'. When four regional champions join the Six, they play a national league.

### **Age and level of the of the Player in Church Boys**

In Church Boys, age of the player will be from 15 years of age to 24 years of age. Most of the player should have done the basic training. Some of them even have experience of playing in first division. We keep potential teenager players for future use.

### **Communicating Language of the Coach**

We can use only Nepali and English language at the moment while coaching in Church Boys. We don't have translator for other language.



### **Training Dates**

Level 1, Winter Coaching, December 1, 2011 through February 9, 2012, (71 Days).

Level 2, Spring Coaching, March 1 –May 31, 2012 (92 days)

Level 3, Performance, summer, June 1 through July 31, in National C division qualifying.

Level 4, Game, autumn, 1 September through 30 November, 2012, (91 days)

### How many Practices and game per week?

1. Four days Practice,
2. 2 days game, (friendly and others),
3. One day Holiday.

### Are Player paid for their Play?

Yes, player is paid for their profession according to their capacities and abilities.



## Vacancy for the Coach in Church Boys

Church Boys United, a non-division team in Nepal, is looking for Soccer coach who would coach the team and take them to different tournaments and eventually participate in National League, beginning from 'C' division. If success continues, club can reach to 'B' division in a year. Church Boys United is only the Christian team in Nepal that has been participating in nationwide tournament and has already impacted the soccer world. Church Boys United participated in C divisions qualifying games in 2011 but it fail to qualify.

### Type of Coach Needed:

- Non-alcoholic, Non-smoking, not using profane words.
- Lovable and must have knowledge of the Bible.
- Must have at least 'C' grade coaching license or equivalent to it.
- Must have experience in coaching at least two years.
- Must lead player to Church on Saturday.
- A Christian that professes Jesus Christ is Lord.

## What are the Facilities for the Coach?

- ✓ Housing and Laundry provided.
- ✓ Water, Breakfast, Lunch and dinner is provided.
- ✓ Internet service provided.
- ✓ Domestic travel expenses are covered up.
- ✓ Visa process and fees provided.



## What you should not expect?

- ✗ You should not expect car or vehicle.
- ✗ You would not be paid, (would receive gift upon departure, it could be anything).

## What we expect from you?

- ❖ Soccer Materials, (balls, training t-shirts, marker, shocks, shoes and sports items).
- ❖ We expect that you would be sharing God's message in the groups and in the Churches.
- ❖ Good leadership in-front of the believers and players.

### What do we have now?

We have balls, marker, beeps, training jerseys, first aid box and basic resources to start up the training and players available for the training. Players are comprised of Christians and non-Christians.



### Other Projects by Church Boys

#### Primary School for Poor Children

Church Boys is starting School for Poor Children in Dungdunge in Ilam in east Nepal where students need to cross river and walk two hour to get to the nearest school. When they

come back home they are tired, exhausted and hungry. It is everyday life of the children of age 5 to 15. We are building school so that they don't have to suffer like this.

### **Orphanage Feeding**

Church Boys is helping the orphanage in Urlabari in Morang. In this orphanage, extremely poor children, orphans and widows are kept. Their food, uniforms and school fees are provided by the child's sponsor.

### **Is your club legal or registered?**

Yes, Church Boys United Football Club was registered on April 19, 2009 in the National Sports Council, Lalitpur, and Registered no. 23.
